Community Spotlight: Springfield/ Hampden County




- Be flexible! I think sometimes we (professionals in the field) get hung up on what we've always done; what didn't work before- and are scared/ timid to try again, and afraid to truly think out of the box and towards what individuals "actually" need.
- Really working on our By-Name- Lists and thinking about how we will prioritize our list.
- Being free to discuss ideas, and change our prioritization and re-evaluating it every few months allowed us to see what works, and what doesn't.





Community Spotlights: Hennepin County




- Everything in regard to other communities, especially ones similar to Hennepin County.






% of youth who have been housed who identify as gender-diverse, LGBQ+ or youth of color

GENDER IDENTITY


Of youth on the BNL, what proportion are gender-diverse? Of youth who have been housed, what proportion are gender-diverse?






SEXUAL ORIENTATION

Of youth on the BNL, what proportion are LGBQ+? Of youth who have been housed, what proportion are LGBQ+?










RACE/ETHNICITY

On the Horizon

"More targeted navigation for youth experiencing homelessness.

"Continuing to identify those in need of services who often "slip through our cracks".

"Adding in providers to the youth and young adult case conferencing process who aren't funded by HUD

"Moving from 'assessment blitz' phase to actually using the priority score to match young people to vacancies

"Discussing ways that diversion can be incorporated into the initial client-case manager interaction with a focus on evidence-based practices such as motivational interviewing and trauma informed care. The goal of diversion would be to empower youth in their own problem solving to exit youth homelessness without immediately entering youth into emergency services.
