# Celebrate Successes

"We have held **youth specific case conferencing** for CE since April. We have a better process of gathering data and our dashboard is much better.

"Our community plans on **using the consolidated CELC data** to understand how to **allocate future resources**.

"Getting the CoC to acknowledge the need for and allow a **separate youth CES**.

"We launched 6 Access Points and **began assessing** young people!

"We have implemented new by-name list policies that are really helping us to maintain more accurate and up-to-date data for youth in our community which is helping us to have a much **clearer picture of what's going on and where we have gaps**.

# Community Spotlight: Springfield/ Hampden County



- Be flexible! I think sometimes we (professionals in the field) get hung up on what we've always done; what didn't work before- and are scared/ timid to try again, and afraid to truly think out of the box and towards what individuals "actually" need.
- Really working on our By-Name- Lists and thinking about how we will prioritize our list.
- Being free to discuss ideas, and change our prioritization and re-evaluating it every few months allowed us to see what works, and what doesn't.

- We are close to implementing community cards.
- We are doing a lot of work on incorporating HUD category 3 youth.

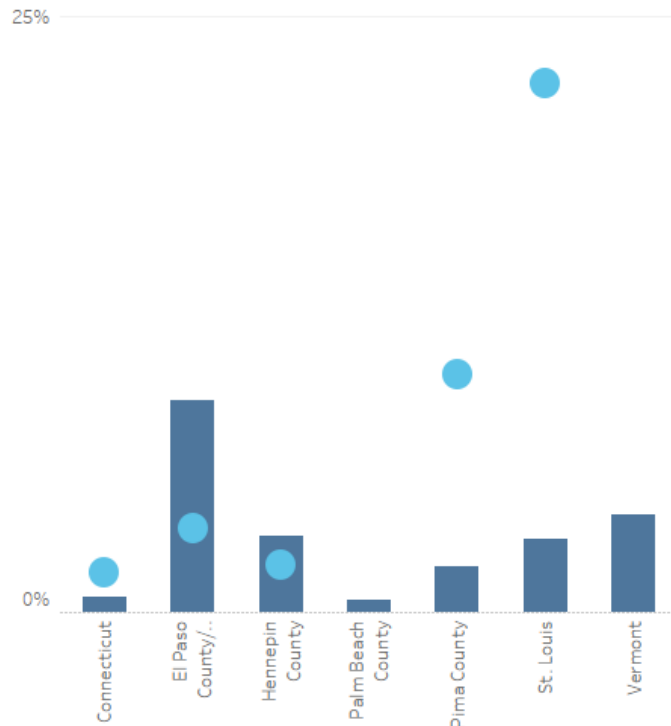

 % of youth who have been housed who identify as gender-diverse, LGBTQ+ or youth of color

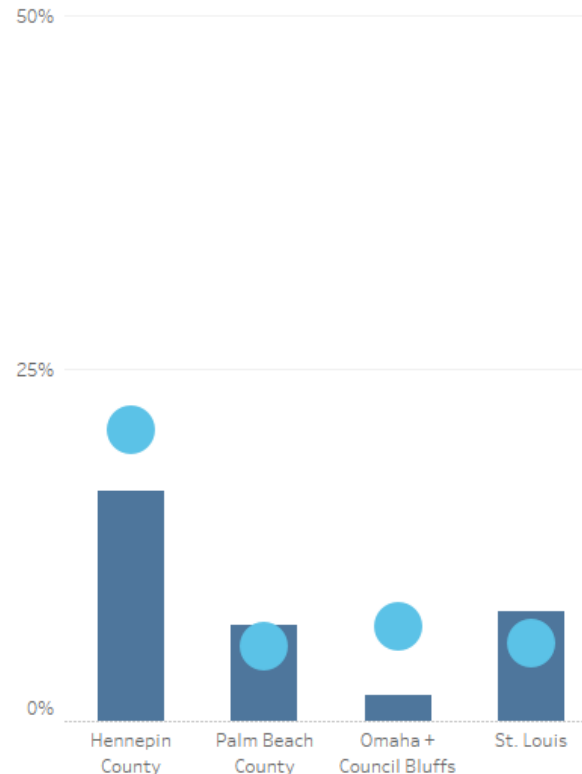
## GENDER IDENTITY

Of youth who have been housed, what proportion are gender-diverse?



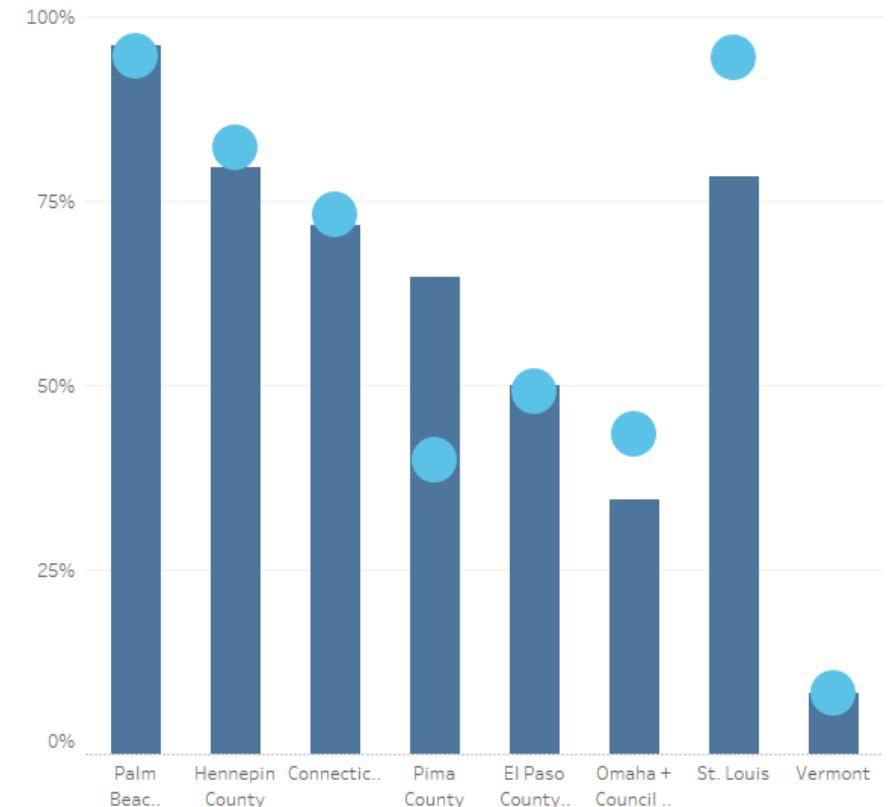
## SEXUAL ORIENTATION

# On the Horizon

"More **targeted navigation** for youth experiencing homelessness.

"Continuing to identify those in need of services who often **"slip through our cracks"**.

"**Adding in providers** to the youth and young adult case conferencing process who aren't funded by HUD

"Moving from 'assessment blitz' phase to actually **using the priority score to match** young people to vacancies

"Discussing ways that **diversion can be incorporated into the initial client-case manager interaction** with a focus on evidence-based practices such as motivational interviewing and trauma informed care. The goal of diversion would be to empower youth in their own problem solving to exit youth homelessness without immediately entering youth into emergency services.
